



Why is London such an interesting place to live?



This curriculum newsletter provides an overview of your child's learning this half term in year five. Where it is possible, we will make learning links with our topic, 'Why is London such an interesting place to live?' to help the children place their learning in context.

In **ENGLISH** the children will be reading verses from *The Highwayman* to then create their own London poems. In addition to this we will be creating our own non-chronological report about London and revisiting persuasive texts.

In **Science** the children will be learning about materials and reversible and irreversible changes.

Geography the children will be learning about the geography of their capital city and important landmarks there. They will use London transport maps.

MATHEMATICS

In **Mathematics** the children will be learning about: reading and interpreting timetables, reading and interpreting statistics, calculating with fractions, decimals and percentages.

HISTORY

As part of our topic, the children will be learning about the history of medicine and diseases in London.

In **Music** the children will be exploring beat in a Music Express topic 'Keeping Healthy'.

In **Art and DT** the children will be creating silhouette art of the London skyline and having a go at making their own graffiti art!

We will be consolidating our knowledge of written calculation methods, rounding factors, multiples and to 3 decimal places. Where possible, links to our 'London' topic will be made to enrich and contextualise their learning in maths.

In **COMPUTING** the children will be learning about Robotics and systems.

In **PE** the children will be learning Games - Cricket: Striking and Fielding.

In **RE** the children will be learning about the religion of Islam: what is it and how it is expressed.

In **PSHE** the children will be learning about democracy in the UK.
In **SMSC** the children will be learning about multiculturalism and diversity,

In **Spanish** the children will be learning basic conversation through song and activities.
