



# Home Learning - Year 1

Maths	English
<p><b>Rows of coins</b></p>  <p>1. Take five coins: 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p. Put them in a row using these clues. The total of the first three coins is 27p. The total of the last three coins is 31p. The last coin is double the value of the first coin.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b></p> <p>Video yourself reading some of your favourite story using your best expression. Perhaps you could use puppets or props to help</p>
<p>Place the numbers 1 - 6 in the circles. Numbers next to each other must not be joined. For example, 3 must not be joined to 2 or 4.</p> 	<p><b>Spelling and handwriting</b></p> <p>Follow the link to practise your spellings, you can play some fun games on here as well as learning important spelling rules. <p>Take ten cards numbered 0 to 9.</p>  <p>Arrange the cards like this.</p>  <p>Do it so that no two consecutive numbers are next to each other, horizontally, vertically or diagonally.</p>	<p><b>Grammar</b></p> <p><u>Imperative verbs</u></p> <p>These are words that tell you to do something. Listen to the song in the link below for some excellent examples. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oApd0goKJDM">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oApd0goKJDM</a></p> <p>Create a word bank of as many imperative verbs as you can think of.</p>
<p><b>Nature Tallies</b></p> <p>Spend a week carrying out a bird census in your garden. Spend 15 minutes each day (for 7 days) counting how many birds you see. Record the numbers as a tally chart –</p>  <p>After the 7 days total up how many birds you saw .</p>	
<p><b>Times tables</b></p> <p>Use the website <b>times tables rock stars</b> to practise your two, five and ten times tables. <a href="https://trockstars.com/">https://trockstars.com/</a> Practise your times tables for 30 minutes a day.</p>	<p><b>Writing composition</b></p> <p>Write me a set of instructions, using imperative verbs, to show me how to do something.</p> <p>Don't forget to boss me about - I promise I won't mind!</p>

2. How are the characters feeling? How do you know?
3. Find a word that means .....
4. What do you think will happen next?
5. What happened in the story?
6. What did you like about the story? What did you dislike about the story?
