Key definitions

Science:

Fair test: A test which controls all but one variable when answering a scientific question.
 Compare: To view something in relation to another.
 Observe: To carefully watch or listen to something in order to gain information.
 Variables: Any part of a scientific test which can be changed.

Geography:

Capital city: A city within a country which is usually the location of the government’s central meeting place.

History:

Timeline: A way of showing events in the order they happened.
 Chronological order: The order in which things happen.

Music:

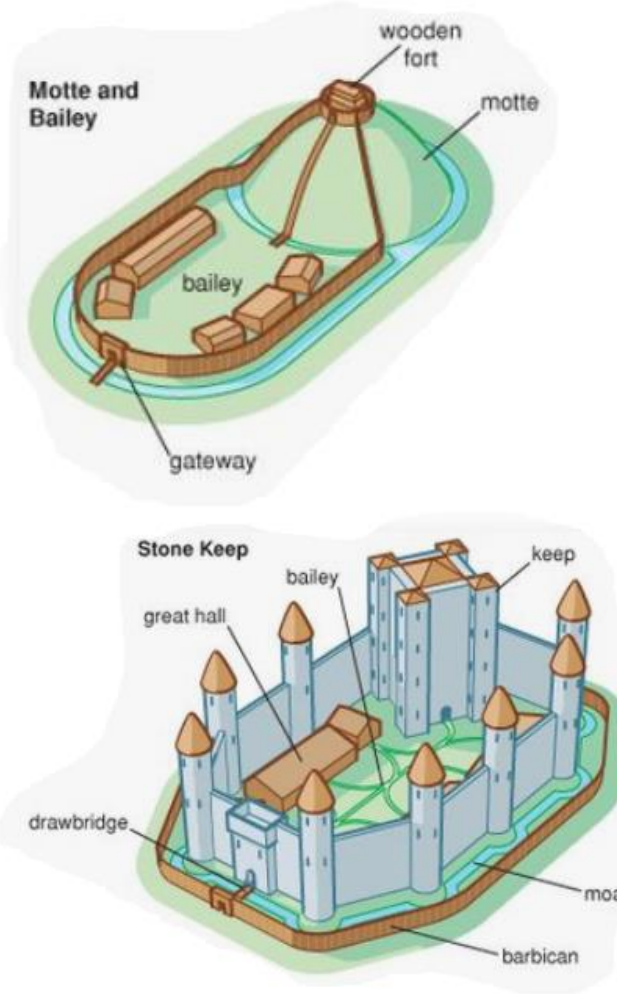
Chant: Repeated phrases often sung or shouted by a group.
 Pitch: High to low.
 Volume: Loud or quiet.
 Vocal: Use of voice.
 Tempo: Speed of the musical piece.

 King William II begins work on the stone keep.



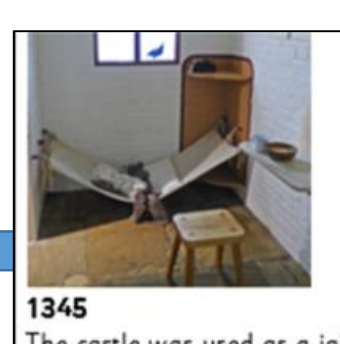
1100
 King William dies so his brother King Henry I continues the work.



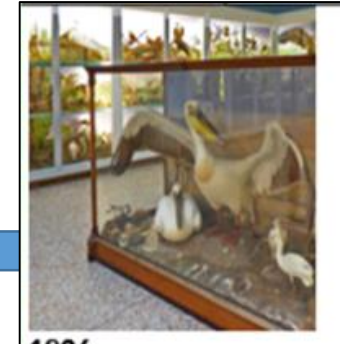
1121

1345
 The castle was used as a jail for over 500 years.



1894
 The castle is turned into a museum.
