




Autumn 1- Year 3

For example, you could collect one from your front garden, one from your back garden, one from the park, one from the woods. Compare the similarities and differences and why you think this is. Draw a diagram of each soil and label it with words to describe it!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Calculations</p> <p>Start at any number and add 10, 100 or subtract 10 or 100 mentally.</p> <p>What do you notice? Can you write a rule?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Design Technology</p> <p>Design and/or make a 3D model of an Egyptian sarcophagus. Don't forget to label your design.</p>

If you designed your own flag for Egypt what would it look like?</p>

What did you use to help you? Can you compare the weight of these items to something with a fixed weight around the house (eg.
